

Program Improvements

Food Pantry

In June, the Food Pantry moved out of the main office and into the shop next door. With this move, there is 9 times more space to store food and have a large walk-in freezer. This gives our clients more autonomy in their food choices as they can shop for themselves, and have more options.

Homeless Shelter

Over the summer, the family unit renovations in the upstairs of the shelter were completed. The upstairs now has 4 private family bedrooms, a kitchenette, living room, and bathroom. These units allow families in need to stay together during times of crisis.

During the COVID pandemic, we helped temporarily house families in motels so that they would be able to stay together. We helped 55 clients, including 28 children.

We have seen that despite having similar numbers of clients staying in the shelter, they are typically staying for longer than before. This can be due to a variety of issues such as lack of affordable housing, increased living costs, and limited low-income housing programs.




